ACEs in Education on the ACEs Connection Network

This presentation explains why 100+ people a week are joining ACEs Connection Network, what they get out of it, and how it supports their work on a national, state and local level. In particular, the ACEs in Education group has become the go-to place for information about trauma-informed schools, and about how to integrate trauma-informed, resilience-building practices based on ACEs research.

The sites focus on research about adverse childhood experiences, and how people are implementing trauma-informed and resilience-building practices based on that research.
